- 100% of respondents indicated that they are confident in their leadership skills both within and outside of the classroom
- 86% understand the needs of diverse learners and plan and implement lessons accordingly
- 100% of respondents indicated they are confident in their ability to present content to student in meaningful and relevant ways.
- 86% of respondents indicated that are able to use a variety of instructional methods to positively impact student learning.
- 86% modify their practice as needed to meet the needs of their students
